Clear Thinking

They are pushing the covid vaccines mighty hard. Talk is no longer of herd immunity, but of 100% vaccination. This is typical of the whole covid caper. A two-week flatten-the-curve shutdown morphs into months, even many months, of lockdown. The curve is pretty darn flat, and has been since early March, but they pawning off a new surge – the so-called delta strain, supposedly more infectious and deadly than previous strains – as a growing danger to every man, woman, and child. And yet the curve has been flat and continues to decline, again since March, despite the fact that the delta strain represents the majority of current infections. Other variants have been identified: the old alpha, beta, gamma, and delta varieties and newer strains including eta, iota, kappa, and lambda. The lambda strain seems to be the next boogiemer that will be touted as even more contagious and deadly than the other strains, thus spawning the next crisis and the push for 110% vaccinations rates.

Despite sounding like frat party gone wrong with all those Greek letters, most people are pretty much over the scare tactics and the hype. Nonetheless, there is even talk of a door-to-door campaign to get everyone vaccinated, at least everyone 12 years and older. The argument is that unless you get vaccinated, you are endangering those who are vulnerable to covid. But wait, aren't the various vaccines like 90-95% effective, even against the known Greek alphabet spectrum of covid strains? Yes, they are. Don't we know who is vulnerable to covid? Sadly, experience has taught us exactly who is most vulnerable. Can the vulnerable get vaccinated? Absolutely. Indeed, there are very few people even among the vulnerable – only those who are allergic to both polyethylene glycol and polysorbate – that are prevented from being vaccinated against covid. Can't we protect those people in other ways as well? Yes, we can. So why does everyone, even those who have already had covid, need to be vaccinated to protect those who can and ought to be vaccinated first and foremost? Are they not saying that we need to protect the protected, we need to protect those who cease to be vulnerable?

When basic logic and clear thinking are as rare as hen's teeth, it is time to worry. We end up with mass murderers, who deliberately exposed and killed thousands of the vulnerable by forcing nursing homes to take in covid patients, remain utterly unpunished while so-called insurrectionists, many of whom are guilty of no greater crime than trespassing, are being held in solitary confinement, not given access to their lawyers, and being denied their right to due process. In a society based on laws, equal protection under the law, and impartial justice, such things could not happen. It happens only when logic and clear thinking are not only unwelcome, but the enemy of many of those in power. You have to go to totalitarian regimes to see such clearly insane behavior. For example, Soviet mental hospitals were filled in the 1980s with people who opposed their war in Afghanistan. The thinking went something like this: the Soviet Union is never wrong, thus to oppose Soviet dogmas and policies is a form of mental illness. This 'mental illness' was labeled sluggish schizophrenia.

Clear thinking and logic are the basis of an ordered and just society. They are also the basis of true religion. As much as many want to claim that faith, especially Judeo-Christian beliefs, is irrational, that is hardly the case. To say that all creation came into being from nothing by accident and that the laws of nature wrote themselves is much less rational than the understanding that an all-powerful, all-knowing God created and ordered it all from nothing. To ascribe god-like power to God hardly seems the work of a lunatic or a sluggish schizophrenic. But to say that eternal nothingness, everlasting nonexistence, could bring forth an ordered universe in a god-like manner, does smack of lunacy.

This is why clear and logical thinking is essential to maintain the faith. The dogmas of our fallen culture, most of which are false (e.g., that men are women and women are men) can't stand by themselves against clear and logical thinking. The dogmas of the Soviet Union (e.g., the government bureaucracy has all of the answers) could not stand by themselves against clear and logical thinking. Christianity, however does not need to be propped up by corrupt media, a web of lies, intimidation, violence, the FBI, the KGB, and the like. No, God stands when all else falls.
