Our Culture is Losing its Mind

How did we get to the point where people now claim that there are a multitude of genders when the obvious, scientific fact is that there are but two and only two true genders? How can we say that the doctor that delivers a baby is supposedly mis-gendering that baby based on the child's obvious anatomy? After all, the obstetrician is a trained professional, an expert in human anatomy, and for all intents and purposes an applied scientist. Yes, there are cases when the baby's anatomy might be ambiguous, but they are rare and can be resolved through DNA testing. Nevertheless, Facepage, among others, allows users to choose over 50 unique genders. Absurd.

But if there are 20 or 50 or 100 genders, all but two being unknown to science since the beginning of rational thought, then surely there are genes that differentiate someone who is supposedly agender from someone who is supposedly gendervoid from someone who is supposedly pangender from someone who is supposedly omnigender. The argument is often made that our DNA defines what we are and there are claims that people do not choose to be this-or-that. If so, then this-or-that ought to be expressed in the genetic makeup of each one of us. If these until recently unknown genders are not defined by DNA like male and female, then the so-called gender spectrum is an artifact of the mind and all of the factors that go into making each of our minds what they are.

That there are spectra of traits associated with masculinity and femininity might be confused with the idea of a spectrum of genders. Men and women share a multitude of common traits, but there are traits that tend to be more common among men and others more common among women. But a man being empathetic and kind does not mean that he is not a man any more than a woman who is competitive and aggressive is not a woman. Likewise, a man might be aggressive and competitive but mellows with age becoming more peaceful and less ambitious. Does that mean he becomes less of a man or more of a woman? Hardly. Does that mean he is assuming a new gender as he ages? Absurd.

The constant culture wars that have raged over the past 50 years almost certainly have contributed to this situation. When we are bombarded with the lies that we live in a vast patriarchy and that men live much easier and fulfilling lives than women, might this inspire someone to become part of the patriarchy and others to opt out? Might the war on motherhood be a factor? Or the objectification and exaltation and near deification of feminine beauty? Or taking marital relations out of marriage, cheapening this God-given gift and reducing it to a mere commodity, separating the act from procreation and marital bonding through adultery, fornication, contraception, and abortion? When men and women refuse to live as God intended, betraying their feminine and masculine dignity, should we be surprised that new and novel undignified forms of living result?

One of the biggest culprits in the sad situation is the absolute lie that maleness and femaleness are simply social constructs. In the early 1960s a pair of twin boys, based on 'expert' advice, were raised one as a boy and the other as a girl. The reprehensible doctor assured the parents that the boy raised as a girl, who had been accidentally emasculated as a baby, would simply grow up to be a woman so long as they raised him as a girl. The doctor had no basis for this claim but used these twin boys to 'prove' his theory that gender is a social construct, not an innate quality determined by biology. Using these twins, the doctor published false data showing that a boy could be raised as a girl. This falsified experiment is still used to justify what is happening today despite the fact that the boy raised as a girl rejected womanhood and would later commit suicide.

This case proved that maleness is innate and the same could be said of femaleness. So instead of admitting that gender is not a social construct, there is an insistence that opposite gender hormones and surgery are required to impose a socially constructed gender. The recourse to hormones and surgery demonstrates that gender is not a social construct. That doctor played God with those twins resulting in disaster. More doctors and politicians are playing God with children today. When we play God, is it likely that good will result? Do we think we are smarter than God? Really?
